2NOT1 promotes the safety and well-being of children by implementing strategies to keep fathers involved and families together.

## Changing the lives of children...

### 2NOT1 Programs

- **“High Road” Parenting Leadership Program** “Strengthen families through Advocacy and Education.” 39 families received advocacy and case management while navigating the family court system and child protection services.
- **Clothes Closet** is the only clothes closet that offers attire for the men in our community. The closet has suits, shirts, ties, belts, and shoes for men, and the closet also has clothes for the entire family. The closet opened in June 2022 and since then, 95 individuals/families benefited from the donated items.
- **theBLUEPRINT Rites of Passage (ROP)** is a 20-weeks mentoring program for boys transitioning from adolescence to maturity, and 25 African American boys received ongoing mentoring.
- **Girls’ Group** is a mentoring program for girls transitioning from adolescence to maturity, and 32 girls participated.
- **The Parent Advocate Program** provides mentorship to parents engaged in the Child Protection System, and 169 parents have received resources or direct services from our office.
- **2NOT1 “TINIMISY” Martial Arts Personal Development** is a weekly martial arts program that works with children 6 to 17 and adults of all ages. 33 students enrolled and 37 hours of instruction time was provided to the 33 students.

### 2NOT1 Significant Moments

- **2NOT1 was** recognized as a non-profit in the state of Kentucky and officially recognized as a non-profit with 501-C3 status in 2007.
- **Inaugural Fatherhood Conference** at the Muhammad Ali Center. To date, 5 successful fatherhood conferences have promoted and raised awareness to responsible fatherhood for over 300 fathers and practitioners.
- **Annual Fatherhood Cook-out** promotes spending quality time with children and peer-parenting between fathers. To date, over 3300 served.
