Clap-in
Everybody stands
One at a time each person shares something they expect to learn today or something about why they are in the cohort

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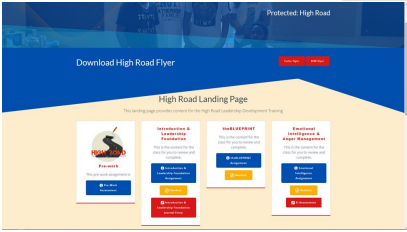

for your contribution in any situation

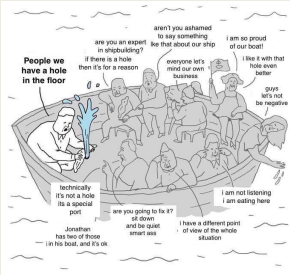
Teaches blaming has no place in leadership

Non-judgemental

Introduction - Who are you and what do you want people to know about you after you speak?

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This week's homework (keep in notebook)



1. Learn all the information about your child(ren). Example: Child's healthcare provider, caregivers, school teacher, school phone, school email, clothing size, favorite color, etc.
2. Capture anything that stressed you. Example: an argument with a friend, something your child did, etc.
3. Capture what made you happy, made you smile. Example: Favorite show, child did something great, a friend did something nice for you, etc.
4. Think of two conflicts you could not avoid. Examples need to be narrated. Ex. Susan said I did not take out the garbage. I jumped up, pointed to the empty garbage can and said I did! She went in the bathroom and pointed to the waste basket and said I didn't. I gave her the side eye.

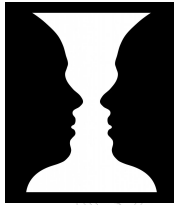
